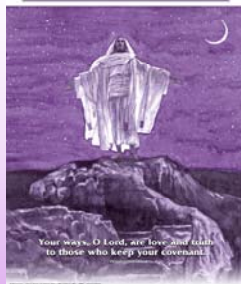




Welcome to all who celebrate the Mass with us today. May God's grace and peace fill us all so that we can serve one another in unity and love.

FIRST SUNDAY Of Lent



"I set my bow in the clouds as a sign of the covenant between me and the earth." The story of Noah contains a beautiful image of the rainbow as a string around God's finger – a reminder. Our weekly celebration of the Eucharist is a reminder to us of the covenant we have with God. Each week the Lord's Day is a sign of our spiritual nature and our connection to the infinite. The spiritual part of our lives, however, does not exist in isolation. Just as Jesus experienced both angels and wild beasts in his forty days, we too must bring our spiritual and physical lives together. The tradition of our church is to do just that through sacrifice. We give things up for Lent. We give alms. Throughout the year our sacrificial giving is an indication of how we seek to integrate the world of the spiritual kingdom with the affairs of our earthly existence.

This Sunday the readings are: (1) Genesis 9: 8-15 (2) 1 Peter 3:18-22 (3) Mark 1:12-15 (23). **(Gather # 1017 Year B)**
Next Sunday the readings will be: (1) Genesis 22: 1-2, 9, 10-13, 15-18 (2) Romans 8, 31-34 (3) Mark 9, 2-10. **(Gather # 1020 Year B)**

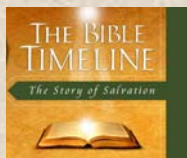

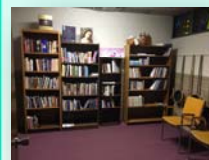

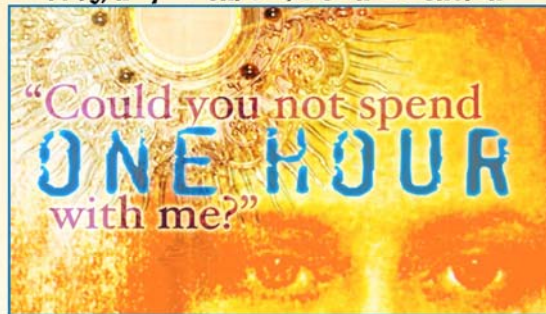


FLOWERS ON EASTER ENVELOPE

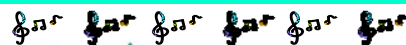

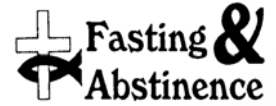

**Lenten Reminders – Fast and
Abstinence**



Please note the following information from the Archdiocese on fasts and abstinence:

Ash Wednesday, February 14th

Good Friday, March 30th are days of abstinence from meat and also days of fast: that is, limited to a single full meal. With regard to Good Friday, the teaching of the Second Vatican Council should be recalled.

Let the paschal fast be kept sacred. Let it be celebrated everywhere on Good Friday and, where possible, prolonged throughout Holy Saturday, so that the joys of the Sunday of the Resurrection may be attained with uplifted and clear mind. *Constitution on the Liturgy, No. 110.*

The other Fridays of the season of Lent are days of abstinence from meat. The law of abstinence binds all Catholics 14 years of age and older. The law of fasting binds all Catholics from their 18th birthday until their 59th birthday (canons 97 and 1252).

With regard to the obligatory days listed above, however, there are frequent questions about the degree of seriousness of the matter. The teaching of the Holy Father may be simply paraphrased: the obligation to do penance is a serious one; the obligation to observe, as a whole or "substantially," the penitential days specified by the Church is also serious. No one should be scrupulous in this regard; failure to observe an individual day of penance is not considered serious.

People should seek to do more rather than less. Fast and abstinence on the days prescribed should be considered a minimum response to the Lord's call to penance and conversion.

The Way of the Cross



Traditional Stations of the Cross will be held every Friday at 7:00PM in the Church during Lent. If you haven't prayed the Way of The Cross for a few years please consider joining us for this beautiful devotion honoring the Passion and Death of Christ. The devotion originated in imitation of the early Christian practice of visiting the scenes of Christ's passion in the Holy Land.

Music During Lent

Music has the power of capturing the spirit of a liturgical season in a profound way. The General Instruction of the Roman Missal specifically points out that instruments should be used "with a moderation that is consistent with the season's character" and should be used only "to support the singing" of the assembly during Lent (no. 313).

We will change the tone of our music during this season- to a more reflective mood and work to support our community in their Lenten journey. Join us in reflecting on some of the words found in the Scripture readings of Lent: return, mercy, reconciliation, fasting, prayer, giving, covenant, test, light, kindness. The music of the season will express a penitential stance while at the same time giving voice to our hope and confidence in the God whose will is always to save, redeem, and reconcile. There will be no Gloria. We will sing the Kyrie and the Gospel Acclamation.

We humbly trust that our music reflects the simplicity of the season and draws you into prayerful worship.
