





Today (Feb. 2) is observed as World Day for Consecrated Life. Saint John Paul II said its purpose is to help the entire Church esteem ever more greatly the witness of those persons who chose to follow Christ by their practice of the evangelical counsels. This means they imitate Jesus in poverty, chastity, and obedience as we see Him demonstrate in the Gospels.

St. John Paul II continues that this day is also a time for consecrated persons to renew their commitment and rekindle their fervor for offering themselves to

the Lord. Please join me in a prayer of thanksgiving for those who said yes to consecrated life. Let's also pray that many more will have the courage to follow Jesus in this selfless way of life.

Poor Saint Asgar. We never celebrate his optional memorial because he shares a date with the optional memorial of Saint Blaise. And we always celebrate the memorial of Saint Blaise so we can get our throats blessed during Mass.

On Monday, Feb. 3, we will offer the blessing of throats following the Universal Prayer (General Intercessions) during our 7:45 a.m. Mass at Mary, Help

of Christians and 8:30 a.m. Mass at St. Luke. We will also add an 8 a.m. Mass at St. Brigid. Our school students will also participate at St. Luke and St. Brigid.

Lent begins next month. How will you and your family plan to have the most fruitful Lent ever? We will be reminded of the three pillars of Lent: Prayer, Fasting and Almsgiving.

The ultimate prayer is the Eucharist. Many of the faithful will offer that prayer at Mass on weekdays, as well as on Sundays. Many families will also pray a family Rosary or the Liturgy of the Hours to live a better Lent. It is always a good idea to receive the Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation (Confession) during Lent to prepare for Easter. Other devotions, such as Stations of the Cross and Chaplet of Divine Mercy, are also right and just.

Some people will fast either individually or communally. We can fast from many different things and in many different ways. Fasting from food is quite common. We can do a complete fast for a period of time or fast from certain things. Some people fast by eating simple meals; one example being bread and water. It has become more common also to fast from the things that could distract us from God such as the internet, television, secular music, etc.

Almsgiving means that we practice charity. Lent is a time for us to be generous with our talents, time, and resources. No matter how much we have or lack, acts of charity in public or private are always possible.
