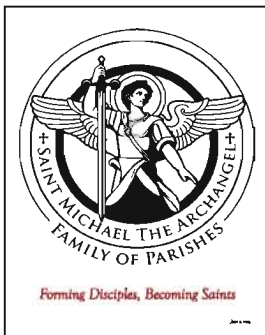

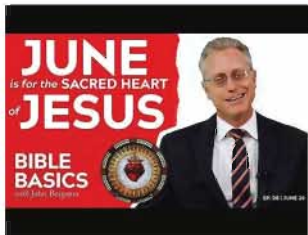
TENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Beloved in Christ,

Even though we have been back in Ordinary Time for a couple of weeks now, we have celebrated some glorious Solemnities the last two Sundays. So, this weekend may be the first time we have seen green vestments in several months. Green is symbolic of hope, growth and life; all important for our formation as Christians. Point being: Ordinary Time is not so ordinary. How will your family make the most of it?

Did you notice our **logo on the front of the bulletin**? After much prayer and asking for the intercession of St. Michael himself, this is the one we landed on for St. Michael the Archangel Family of Parishes. Because the military and aerospace are such a large component of our community, we asked the designer to remember that in the logo. The large sword belongs to our Lord's leading spiritual warrior in the fight against evil, and the style of the wings is a tribute to aerospace heritage. St. Michael, pray for us!

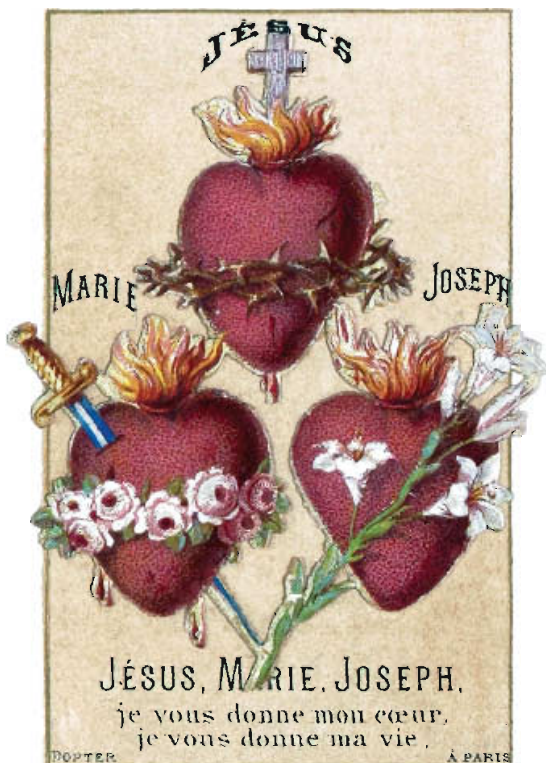
GENDER DYSPHORIA SUPPORT GROUP

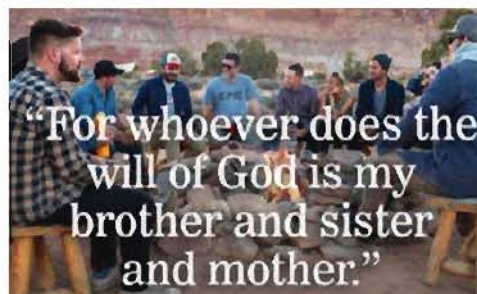

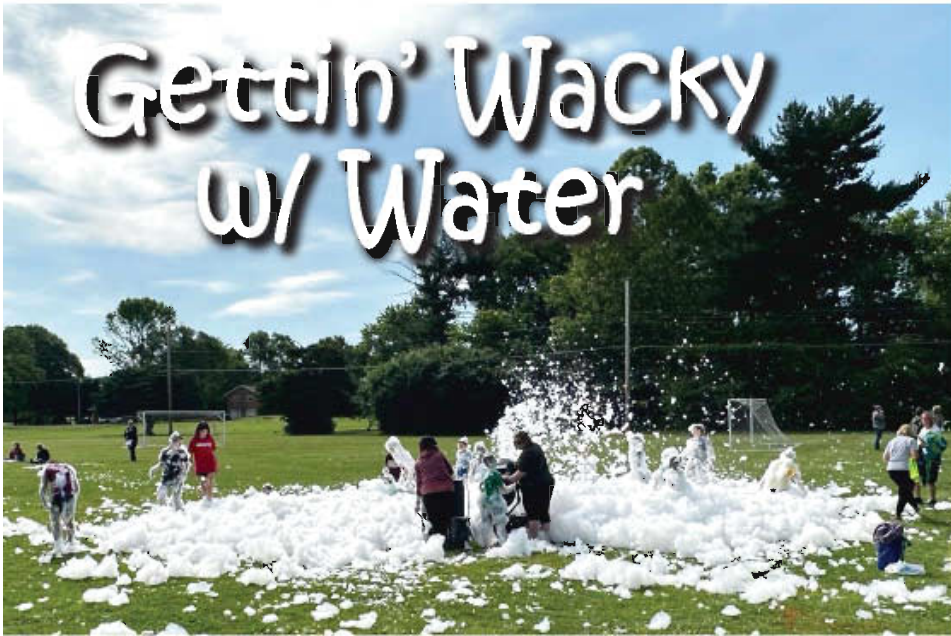

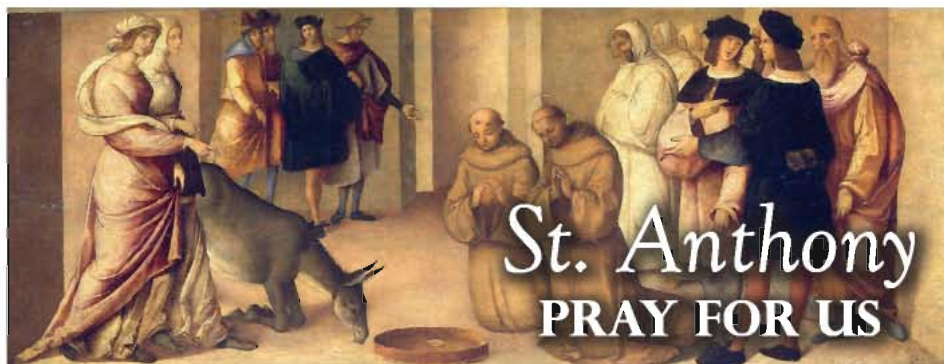
