

Beloved in Christ,

On Saturday of this weekend, the Church celebrates the Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul, the Apostles. When I was in seminary, I spent two summers in Honduras trying to learn Spanish. During both summers, on June 29, the Cardinal Archbishop of Tegucigalpa ordained new deacons. Why is that significant? He was inviting the men being ordained to always keep in mind they should have a willingness to lay down their lives for the service of the Church, even in the fashion of these two great saints.

I invite you to participate in the historic events of the Eucharistic procession this week, the likes of which we may never see again in our lifetimes. We are privileged that St. Brigid is the entry point of the Blessed Sacrament into the Archdiocese. The important thing is to register to participate, even for visiting St. Brigid during the events this Monday and Tuesday. See page 11 for more information.

All are also welcome to join the pilgrimage when it heads south from Xenia toward our cathedral and a Eucharistic Festival in Cincinnati on July 6. Visit catholicaoc.org/jesus-is-here for more information about all the events scheduled for the Archdiocese before the pilgrimage continues on to the Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis later in July.

Today (June 30) is Fr. John MacQuarrie's last day as pastor of the parishes in Springfield and last day as dean of our Emmanuel B Deanery. Please keep Fr. MacQuarrie in your prayers as he retires. He will certainly be on my list of priest subs. Ad multos annos!




