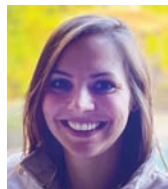

FROM THE ARCHIVES OF EARTH TIPS BY MHC GREEN

Houseplants Purify Your Home Air Through photosynthesis houseplants convert the carbon dioxide we exhale into fresh oxygen and they can also remove toxins from the air we breathe. One NASA experiment in 1989, found that indoor plants can scrub the air of cancer causing volatile organic compounds like formaldehyde and benzene. Later research has found that soil microorganisms in potted plants also play a part in cleaning indoor air. Some plants that are easy care, colorful and safe around children and pets are: Christmas cactus, African violets, baby rubber plants, Swedish ivy, prayer plants and parlor palm. Enjoy these colorful, easy care, nontoxic plants as you make your home air cleaner.

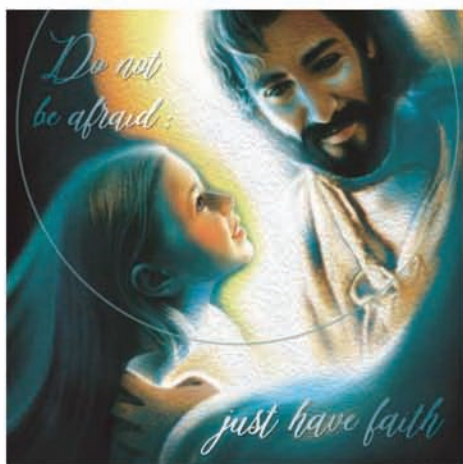

St. Brigid Story

In celebration of St. Brigid's 175th anniversary, parishioners were asked to share parish family reflections and anecdotes. The following story and photos were submitted by Jim and Lynda Kuntz.

We have been members of St. Brigid Parish since 1973. We have an autistic son, Jim, who, at times, made it difficult to attend Mass. It occurred to us as Jim got older that he wouldn't be making his first communion, confirmation, etc.

We asked Fr. VonHolle about this in a letter and he, along with Wyncee Fleisher, Carol Cassidy, and Mary Downing, began--what I believe was the first in the area--a Religion Awareness for the Handicapped program. Because of their patience and understanding, they were able to teach Jim how to receive communion and, through practice, be confirmed.

Things have certainly improved regarding autism and teaching of the mentally disabled; but, I believe St. Brigid was ahead of the times in this regard. Jim is 54 years old now, but he is still a "good Catholic boy" in our opinion. Thanks to St. Brigid Parish. Of course, he is still autistic and wants the same pew every time he's at church. But that's just Jim!

A St. Brigid team effort prepared Jim Luntz for the day of his first communion with Fr. VonHolle (pictured above) and to receive confirmation into the Catholic Church (pictured at right).

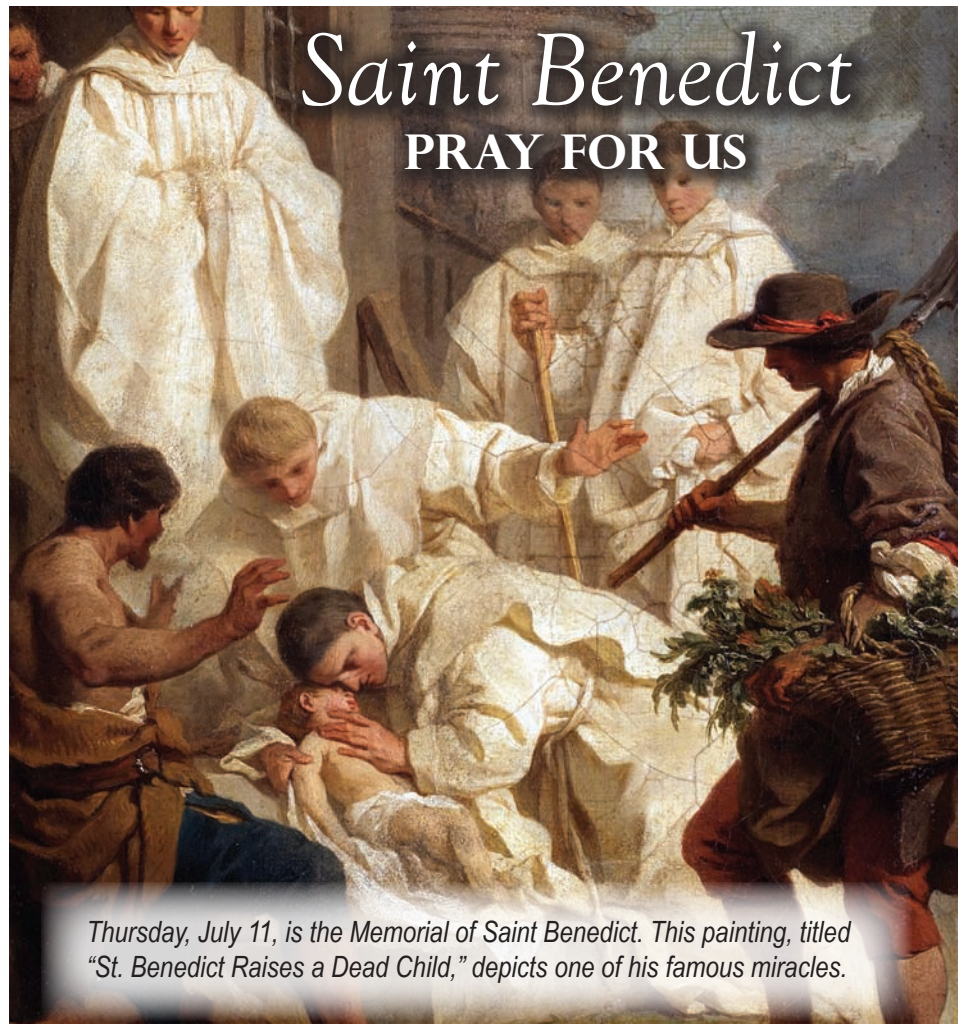
