



Beloved in Christ,

This Tuesday, July 16, is the Memorial of Our Lady of Mt. Carmel. See page 13 for details about a Solemnity Mass that evening at St. Luke. Those who bring along a brown scapular will also have an opportunity for enrollment immediately after Mass (a limited amount of scapulars generously provided by a parishioner will also be availabe for anyone in need).

Enrollment in the brown scapular is also not limited to Tuesday's Mass. Please feel free to approach any of our priests after any Mass to request enrollment in the confraternity.

It has been more than 80 years since the last national Eucharistic Congress in the United States. This week, many of our parishioners will make history by participating in the next Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis. Please pray for the safety of those traveling and for a deeper love for Jesus in the Eucharist for all the faithful. I look forward to seeing you at Mary, Help of Christians' 51st Summer Festival next weekend. More details are on page 6.

Back in 2004, Pope Saint John Paul II blessed six monstrances for use during the Year of the Eucharist. We are blessed to be using one of these monstrances on Wednesday, July 24, at St. Brigid. Mass will be at 8 a.m. as usual, followed by exposition of the Blessed Sacrament. I invite you to bring the family for a visit at some point during the day. See page 4 for more information.



Reflection on Today's Readings

The readings focus on God's call, mission and blessings. In Amos, God calls a shepherd to be a prophet, showing He can call anyone.

Ephesians reminds us of our spiritual blessings in Christ, including being chosen, redeemed, and sealed with the Holy Spirit.

In Mark, Jesus sends out the Twelve apostles with authority, telling them to travel light and trust in God. They preach repentance, heal the sick and cast out demons. They are to rely on God and the hospitality of others. The apostles were sent to preach repentance. This teaches us the importance of turning away from sin and believing in God's message. Jesus instructs the apostles to take minimal supplies. This shows that we should trust God to provide for our needs.

God calls each of us to a mission. We should listen for His call and be ready to respond. Trust is key in our mission—trusting God to provide for us as we do His work. Repentance is also important—turning away from sin and following God more closely.
