# Family Flocknote community eclipses 1,000-member mark

Sign-up solutions, assistance available for troubleshooting Flocknote communication

Congratulations to Tom Mangan, a St. Luke parishioner who recently became the 1,000th member of the St. Michael the Archangel Family network on Flocknote. The ability to instantly communicate with parishioners via email and/or text has made Flocknote a very useful and popular tool since it's launch here last summer.

The St. Michael Family is not alone. More than 10,000 churches are enjoying Flocknote, which is why it is very important to sign up for the correct network when joining Flocknote.

Several parishioners have had difficulty trying to join a network for their particular church. While there are many St. Luke and St. Augustine churches out there and on Flocknote, for example, there is no Flocknote network for any of the six parishes that make up the St. Michael Family.

The St. Michael the Archangel Family of Parishes network (designated "SMAFP" by Flocknote) is the network ALL parishioners need to join in order to receive Flocknote communication.

Parishioners can select which of the six churches they want to receive Flocknotes for at sign up. Other Flocknote groups within the St. Michael network, such as Youth Ministry or Funeral Notices, can also be selected.



EARTH TIPS BY MHC GREEN POLLINATORS: BEES, BIRDS AND



BUTTERFLIES In our current fragile environment, the

need for food production is essential for keeping the world's population fed. According to National Geographic, one third of the food consumed by humans is a result of pollinators doing their job on our farms and in our backyard gardens.

Thus, we should offer these pollinators plants that attract them. Consider the space and type of plant that suits your garden. It is helpful to select plants that bloom at various times across the growing season.

The following list will help you get started: Calendula, Pincushion, Bachelor Buttons, Marigold, Salvia, Nasturtium, Lavender, Cosmos, Verbena, Borage, Anise Hyssop, Heliotrope, Yarrow, Oregano, Sunflowers, Coneflowers, Zinnia, Blazing Meadow Star, Penstemon, Aster, Goldenrod, Bee Balm.





#### 20th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Today's readings call us to live with wisdom and understanding. They encourage us to seek true nourishment from Jesus, the Bread of Life, and live in a way that pleases God.

Wisdom's invitation is to a better life. Accepting Wisdom's invitation means making better choices. It means seeking knowledge and understanding, and applying them in our daily lives. Wisdom leads us to live in a way that pleases God and benefits ourselves and others.

Ephesians 5:15-20 urges us to live wisely. Paul tells us to be careful in how we live, making the most of every opportunity. This means being aware of our actions and their impact on our lives and others.

Living wisely also means seeking God's will and following His guidance. This involves avoiding things that can harm us and instead being filled with the Holy Spirit. Paul also encourages us to be joyful and thankful.

In John 6:51-58, Jesus tells us He is the living bread that came down from heaven. He says that anyone who eats this bread will live forever. This bread is His flesh, given for the life of the world.

Jesus contrasts this with the manna the ancestors ate in the desert. They ate the manna and still died. But those who partake in Jesus, the living bread, will have eternal life.

This teaching is central to our faith. Jesus offers Himself as our spiritual nourishment. By receiving Him in the Eucharist, we are united with Him and receive the promise of eternal life.

Feast Day – August 22

The Story of the Queenship of Mary Pope Pius XII established this feast in 1954. But the Blessed Virgin Mary's queenship has roots in Scripture. At the Annunciation, Gabriel announced that Mary's Son would receive the throne of David and rule forever. At the Visitation, Elizabeth calls Mary "mother of my Lord." As in all the mysteries of Mary's life, she is closely associated with Jesus: Her queenship is a share in Jesus' kingship. We can also recall that in the Old Testament the mother of the king has great influence in court.

In the fourth century Saint Ephrem called Mary "Lady" and "Queen." Later Church fathers and doctors continued to use the title. Hymns of the 11th to 13th centuries address Mary as queen: "Hail, Holy Queen," "Hail, Queen of Heaven," "Queen of Heaven." The Dominican rosary and the Franciscan crown as well as numerous invocations in Mary's litany celebrate her queenship.

The feast is a logical follow-up to the Assumption, and is now celebrated on the octave day of that feast. In his 1954 encyclical To the Queen of Heaven, Pius XII points out that Mary deserves the title because she is Mother of God, because she is closely associated as the New Eve with Jesus' redemptive work, because of her preeminent perfection, and because of her intercessory power.




