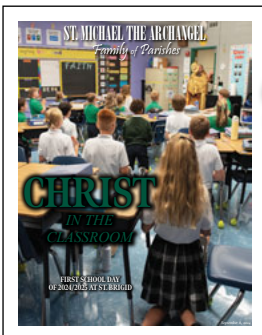

Beloved in Christ,

Please join me in thanking Fr. Lee for his ministry to the St. Michael the Archangel Family of Parishes these past 15 months. Archbishop Schnurr has assigned Fr. Lee to be Parochial Vicar of Our Lady of the Hills Family of Parishes, covering four parishes in Highland and Adams Counties, beginning Oct. 1.

We will thank Fr. Lee publicly with a cake at our Family of Parishes Picnic on Sept. 29 at Sacred Heart (more picnic info on page 9). Fr. Lee's likely new address is Holy Trinity Church, 612 E. Mulberry Street, West Union, Ohio, 45693.

This Thursday, I will participate in workshops for Mental Wellness Ministry Training and Project Rachel Clergy Training. Hopefully you have noticed the Project Rachel announcements in our Flocknote and bulletin before. This ministry is vital as women seek healing from past abortions and fathers deal with the effects of lost fatherhood.

Since so much prayer is needed to heal our land, I invite you to join me as our very own Fr. Blenman leads the first-ever Eucharistic procession from St. Charles Borromeo Catholic Church in Kettering to the abortion facility at E. Stroop and Vineyard next Saturday, Sept. 14, at 9 a.m. More information is on the next page.

Also on Saturday, Sept. 14, at 11 a.m., prayer continues as we observe the National Day of Remembrance for the Unborn at Woodland Cemetery 118 Woodland Ave. in Dayton. All are invited to participate in these important opportunities for prayer.

Rounding out the weekend, Archbishop Schnurr will lead the Rosary at 2:00 on Sunday, Sept. 15, at the same abortion facility at E. Stroop and Vineyard. Join me once again as we pray for healing for those affected, respect for human life, and for an end to elective abortion.

I hope to see you at St. Paul's parish picnic today (Sept. 8) after the 11:30 Mass, and next Sunday (Sept. 15) at St. Luke's parish picnic at 3 p.m.

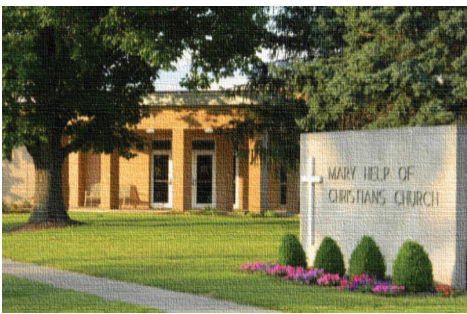


THE MHC HOLIDAY BAZAAR

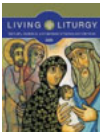

Exaltation of the Holy Cross

In the fourth century, Saint Helena, mother of the Roman Emperor Constantine, went to Jerusalem in search of the holy places of Christ's life. She razed the second-century Temple of Aphrodite, which tradition held was built over the Savior's tomb, and her son built the Basilica of the Holy Sepulcher on that spot. During the excavation, workers found three crosses. Legend has it that the one on which Jesus died was identified when its touch healed a dying woman.

The cross immediately became an object of veneration. At a Good Friday celebration in Jerusalem near the end of the fourth century, according to an

eyewitness, the wood was taken out of its silver container and placed on a table together with the inscription Pilate ordered placed above Jesus' head: Then "all the people pass through one by one; all of them bow down, touching the cross and the inscription, first with their foreheads, then with their eyes; and, after kissing the cross, they move on."

To this day, the Eastern Churches, Catholic and Orthodox alike, celebrate the Exaltation of the Holy Cross on the September anniversary of the basilica's dedication. The feast entered the Western calendar in the seventh century after Emperor Heraclius recovered the cross from the Persians, who had carried it off in 614, 15 years earlier. According to the story, the emperor intended to carry the cross back into Jerusalem himself, but was unable to move forward until he took off his imperial garb and became a barefoot pilgrim. —Franciscan media

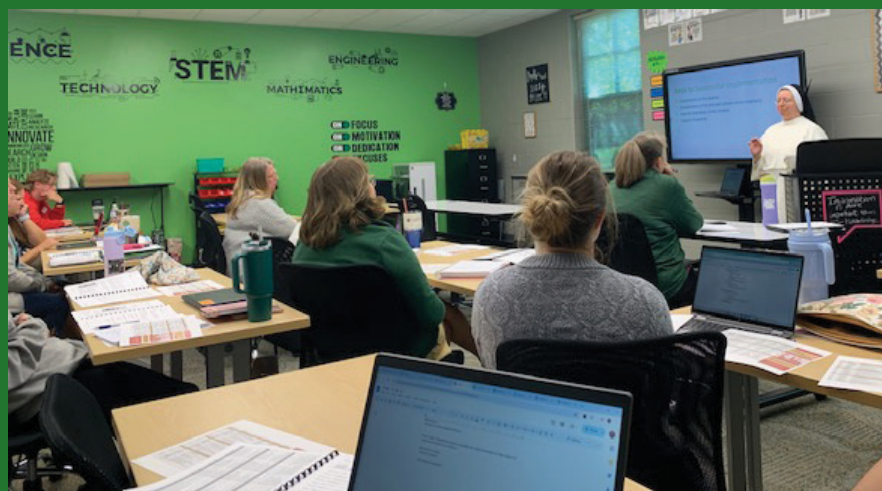
