October 6, 2024 TWENTY-SEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Beloved in Christ,

I understand early voting opens in Ohio this week. We certainly hear plenty of talk of the upcoming election every day, whether we seek it out or not, and it's still about a month away.

As Catholics, the first thing that is certain is that we must vote because we have the unique opportunity to bring Jesus Christ into the public square. It is also certain that we vote from a well-formed conscience.

Well-formed means that it is not based on feelings about candidates but on facts. A well-formed conscience is based on what God has revealed through Sacred Tradition, Sacred Scripture, and Natural Law Reasoning, which is upheld in the teachings of the Church.

I do not find it helpful when people say "Choose the lesser of two evils." First, it is never good to choose evil. And every candidate is flawed in some way. What I find more helpful is to ask: "Which candidate is going to limit evil more?"

So, next we would ask, "What things are intrinsically evil?" The killing of innocent human beings would be an example of something that is always intrinsically evil. The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops provides their guide here: www.usccb.org/resources/forming-consciences-faithful-citizenship-2019



The Sacred Heart Married Couples Group will meet on the third Friday of each month beginning on October 18 at 7 p.m.


Finally, the Sacred Heart Men's Group will meet on the fourth Wednesday of each month beginning on October 23 at 7 p.m.


