THIRTIETH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Beloved in Christ,

Please keep me in your prayers this week as I am on my annual retreat in Valparaiso, Indiana.

This Friday, November 1, is the Solemnity of All Saints, a holy day of opportunity, also known as a holy day of obligation. We will have three vigil Masses as usual on Thursday, October 31. Then we will have eight Masses on November 1. The full schedule is below.

The Solemnity of Christ the King marks the end of the liturgical year on November 24, and is rapidly approaching. This year, the Archdiocese of Cincinnati is designating this same Sunday and Solemnity as "Together Sunday." Begin praying now about which Catholic friend or relative, who does not participate at Mass, you will invite to join you on Together Sunday.

Looking ahead at another holy day of obligation, the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary falls on Monday, December 9. This is an update since the printing of the Ordo, which states that it is not a holy day of obligation.

We also celebrate the Immaculate Conception solemnity as the patronal feast of the United States of America. I look forward to encountering the Living God with you on our nation's patronal feast. We will have eight Masses for the obligation on December 9. More information on this will be forthcoming.

Pope Francis has declared 2025 to be a jubilee year. Our group of pilgrims noticed all the restoration happening in Rome while we were on pilgrimage there earlier this month. Check out iubilaeum2025.va for more information.
